ORDER

Government of India have introduced the provision of self-certification for startups to minimize the cost of regulatory inspection and to avoid impediments in the execution of the work. As per this, Startups are allowed to provide self-certification / third party certification under all the following 6 laws:

1. The Building and Other Constructions Workers' (Regulation of Employment & Conditions of Service) Act, 1996.
2. The Inter-State Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment & Conditions of Service) Act, 1979.
3. The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.
4. The Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970
5. The Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952.
6. The Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948.

In order to self-certify compliance, Government of India have created a portal for registration namely '*Shram Suvidha Portal*'. The Executive Committee of Kerala Startup Mission held on 15.03.2018 has decided that self-certification may be extended to startups from Kerala also with respect to rules and regulations of the State provision and to include the same in the sub policy of the IT Policy, 2017. Accordingly, the Chief Executive Officer, Kerala Startup Mission as per letter read above has proposed to include following points in the Sub Policy of IT Policy, 2017:

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- › All startups who have successfully registered in '*Shram Suvidha Portal*' may be allowed the provision of self-certification with respect to all regulations as applicable to an Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME).
- › Each Startup company will have a unique ID number and the same can be used

to track the profile of the startup.

Government have examined the matter in detail and sanction is accorded to extend the self-certify compliance facility provided in the '**Shram Suvidha Portal**' by Government of India to startups from Kerala also with respect to all regulations and regulations of the State.

Sanction is also accorded to include following points in the Sub policy of IT Policy, 2017

- › All startups who have successfully registered in '**Shram Suvidha Portal**' shall be allowed the provision of self-certification with respect to all regulations as applicable to an Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME).
- › Each Startup company will have a unique ID number and the same shall be used to track the profile of the startup.

ORDER

As per Government order read as 2nd paper above, sanction was accorded to issue unique ID number to the startups coming from outside the state to Kerala subject to satisfying anyone of the following conditions.(1)Startup should have a GST registration in Kerala(2)Startup should have at least 70% of employees of Kerala domicile.(3)Startup should have an office space of not less than 2000 Sq.Ft or 20 seats in one of the startup facilities in Kerala.

2.The Chief Executive Officer, Kerala Startup Mission as per letter read as 3rd paper above has requested to revise the Government orders read as 2nd paper above for the purpose of issuing Unique ID number to startups coming from outside the State to Kerala subject to certain conditions proposed.

3. Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to accord sanction to the Chief Executive Officer, Kerala Startup Mission to issue Unique ID number to Startups coming from outside the State to Kerala subject to the condition that the startups should have a GST registration in Kerala and also satisfying any one of the following conditions:

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- Startup having at least 70% of employees of Kerala domicile.
- Startup having an office space of not less than 2000 Sq. Ft or 20 seats in one of the

startup facilities in Kerala.

4. The Government order read as 2nd paper above stands modified to the above extent.
